## New Online Programs

Online learning can conjure thoughts of getting a college degree while relaxing somewhere warm—at least during Rochester’s winters. But whether students live in another state, another county or in upstate New York, more programs offer the opportunity to graduate without coming to campus.

The B. Thomas Golisano College of Computing and Information Sciences offers its one-of-a-kind Master’s program in Network Security and Systems Administration fully online. The degree program is also available on campus.

For lecture-based classes, most of the faculty uses the Breeze Live web-conferencing system to lecture in front of a campus section while broadcasting the same lecture over the web. Lectures are archived for students who can’t attend either on campus or online for the live session. Team projects facilitated by myCourses and Breeze Live are a key component in most of these courses as well—the online tools being just as effective in class or online.

The E. Phillip Saunders College of Business is offering a new option for students to take online elective courses in the traditional MBA program. Eight of the core MBA courses are now available online to students in other master’s programs. On-campus MBA students can also take the online courses as they transition back to campus to complete the MBA.

These courses use collaborative team projects extensively, supplemented with Breeze Presenter recorded lectures—recorded PowerPoint presentations with captioned audio—and Captivate tutorials—voice-annotated and captioned computer demonstrations.
